


Introduction


We will also continue our mission of promoting PB in LHC. A large membership base means more clout with the City and more income from dues, donations, tournaments, sponsors and so on.

Resource Action Plan (RAP) (Janie Morris)

The Mission of the LHCPBA is to promote the development and growth of pickleball in the Lake Havasu City area for all ages. In order to fulfill that mission, we urgently need more courts at Dick Samp Memorial Park. The City funded the DSP 16-court master plan and the first four courts. Now, it's our turn. Our immediate goal is to raise funds to build four more courts. To that end, Lake Havasu Courts, a 501.c.(3), was created to help fund court construction via tax-advantaged donations.

RAP, a Resources Committee fundraising campaign, will be launched this fall. It will define funding opportunities, implementation strategies and specific actions that will make those next four courts a reality. We hope to have \$100K in the court-building fund by year end 2018.

The first RAP tool, a Pledge Commitment Form, is already available on our website. Check it out - and if you have the wherewithal to do so, please make a pledge commitment. Activity Signups get a High-Tech Upgrade! (Eric Swiech)

SignUpGenius (SUG), an automated activity signup service, can be accessed by computer, smartphone, tablet or iPad. The Board recently approved using SUG for scheduled activities - round robins, clinics, etc. This is a huge step forward. That overwhelming flood of emails we've seen this season? Gone! Emails lost in space, buried in junk mail, viewed too late - no more!

SUG allows coordinators to schedule activities with a defined number of slots. When all slots are filled, no one can sign up, although members can drop out or swap times with other members. LHCPBA is using the free version now but may upgrade to the paid version (at no cost to users) if the extra features are needed. Registering with SUG is optional, but doing so allows users to log in, view scheduled activities, sign up, drop out, and swap with other players.
